## **February Speaker Information:**

Speaker: John Sanfaçon

Title of Talk: Russian Mineral Treasures

#### Speaker Bio:

After 53 years of teaching modern languages at Delbarton School (my alma mater, class of 1957), I retired in June 2016. I no longer live on campus, but in Mount Arlington, in western Morris County on the shore of Lake Hopatcong, the biggest lake totally in NJ. Now I work several days a week (as an unpaid volunteer) as Acting Geology Curator of the Morris Museum in Morristown. I am the Treasurer of the Morris Museum Mineralogical Society, Secretary of the NJ Earth Science Association, and am in charge of the white-light exhibits at the annual NJESA show in April. My collecting tastes are eclectic, with a particular interest in the quartz family and the minerals of Russia, which I have visited six times. When I retired, I left Delbarton with 118 2' x 1' cases of my minerals and fossils which were appraised by Bill Metropolis, former Harvard Museum curator.


Into a fun and educational event enjoyed by over 2,000 people.



#### Do you need mineral flats for your growing collection?

Our member Frances Becker has graciously offered us the ability to buy a custom flat with a black interior for all of the fluorescent mineral nuts in our group, or the collector who is looking for a high contrast interior for their daylight minerals! The flats will be roughly 16-1/2" x 11-1/2" x 5" deep and will be in a thick walled cardboard, that is natural brown in color with the black interior for the bottom portion of the flat. Fluorescent mineral collectors have always wanted a flat like this and now we have our chance! The flats will be \$2.80 per set(top and bottom) and we are trying to get together the minimum order of 500 now. We have about 300 spoken for in the order and are asking for any orders of 50 or 100 to get us to the 500 minimum. I will have a sample of the flat at the February meeting and we thank Frances again for helping to make this a possibility!!!

Wildacres is a school of instruction operated by our regional organization, the EFMLS or Eastern Federation of Mineralogical and Lapidary Societies.

Two EFMLS sponsored sessions are held in May and September and last for one week.

The programs consist of general sessions for the whole group and small-group class sessions covering a variety of topics such as minerals, beading, exhibit, cabochon making, faceting, wire-wrapping, silversmithing, pewter fabrication, PMC, fused glass, soapstone carving, etc. The workshop staff consists of experts in the various areas of the hobby. Most are EFMLS members and all serve without pay to share their knowledge with others.

GLMSMC offers two scholarships for \$425 each this year. The \$425 scholarship covers the entire cost of your stay at Wildacres and includes lodging, 3 meals a day, and classes. Some classes have material fees for which you will be responsible. The scholarships have two conditions: first, being a member of GLMSMC, and second, having a history of working at the Club's Show and/or signing up and working a minimum of 4 hours at the Club's upcoming Show in March.

I have been to Wildacres twice and thoroughly enjoyed myself. Wildacres is located in the Blue Ridge Mountains, on 1600 acres at 3,300 feet in elevation, with excellent views and the sounds of nature all around. 
