**Speaker:** Gabriela Farfan, Ph.D **Focus of Talk:** Research at the Smithsonian

Gabriela Farfan, Ph.D joined the Smithsonian Natural History Museum Department of Mineral Sciences in 2019 as a Curator of Gems and Minerals. She earned her B.Sc from Stanford and her Ph.D. from M.I.T. and the Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution. Her interests include Biomineralogy, Environmental Mineralogy, and Gem Science.

Gabriela has graciously agreed to give a talk to our membership on January 11th, focusing on the research side of the Smithsonian. She will discuss the breadth of current research taking place at the Smithsonian, the behind-the-scenes research facilities, and how she tackles her own research projects— ranging from the snowflake-patterned inclusions in quartz from China to how seasons get trapped in aragonite pearl layers.

Happy New Year! We've been highlighting activities from the Fossils badge lately, and one of the most important things to know about is the geologic timescale. The timescale includes huge periods of time called "eras," then not as huge but still big periods of time called "periods," and finally "epochs." You might read that a particular fossil is from a particular period (such as the Triassic period), or epoch (like the Miocene epoch). Good fossil labels will include this information.

The University of California Museum of Paleontology at Berkeley has put together a great website that helps explain the geologic timescale: <u>www.ucmp.berkeley.edu/education/explorations/tours/</u> <u>geotime/geotime.html</u>. It includes a couple of challenging quizzes (I didn't get them all right) – see how you do. Choose the "student" path on the first page.

I'd love to see pictures of your rock ornament (see December's article), or your collection showing off your fossils, which is another badge activity (see the October article), as well as any interesting fossil-related web links to share with the group. My email address is shown below.


