**Topic of Talk:** "The History of Chromite Mines of Montgomery County, Maryland"

Speaker: Jeff Nagy

Our November speaker will be our own GLMSMC Historian, Jeff Nagy, with a new presentation on the Chromite Mines of Montgomery County, Maryland. Maryland was one of the best earliest suppliers of the tough-to-find mineral and had a thriving mining district based on this. It was mostly controlled by the mining tycoons, Isaac Tyson and Washington Waters, for a period of time. There is a fascinating history to the area that will be shared, along with the mines and personalities associated with this very important and lucrative mining district.

Jeff has always had one of our most popular presentations in "The Gold Mines of Maryland—The Maryland Mine," with an emphasis on Montgomery County. He is extremely well versed in the history and locations of Maryland's copper mines as well and loves to share stories and knowledge on these mostly

**Program for the Night:** Ken Reynolds introduced our speaker for the evening, club member Casper Voogt. The talk was entitled "Trilobites of the West Virginia Area." Trilobites, named for their three body sections, arrived in great numbers during the Cambrian explosion and departed in the Permian extinction. Their great numbers and diversity throughout time have allowed them to be used as an indicator species for time periods in geology and paleontology. Among the great variety in body types are adoptions of eye stalks and spines for hiding and protection.

Spiny examples are of interest to Casper. After a review of some worldwide and further afield U.S. localities, we learned more about Casper's collecting experience in nearby West Virginia. Close to a well-publicized site in Gore, there is a privately-owned site (permissions required) that exposes the aptly named Devonian Needmore formation.

Casper showed examples of *Phacops rana* and *Elderedgeops rana* collected there. He also discussed tips for finding specimens and preparing specimens using pneumatic micro chisels and air abrasion tools. Finally, we were treated to photos of amazing worldwide specimens and provided resources for our own research. Thanks, Casper.

Show table and door prizes were administered by Joel Rosen.

#### Wendell's collection:

- Is now part of the Smithsonian permanent collection over 80 of his specimens are now part of the permanent national reference collection and 1 is currently on display.
- Will be used for club door prizes for the next two years (see pictures below).
- Will be used for youth education.
- Has been auctioned to club members (adults and junior members) so that, in the words of Wendell's daughter: "I'm glad everyone was able to take a little piece of Dad with them."
- The proceeds from the auction will benefit the youth program.
- The youth account is now named the Turner/Mohr fund.



Wendell's first term as club president was in 1983. He was also the EFMLS liaison, editor for many years, unofficial show supervisor, and all-around club expert. He knew everything about the club and helped made it what it is today.

He will be sorely missed.
