GLMSMC Regular Meeting Minutes from November 18, 2024

The 18 November 2024 meeting was called to order by Past-President Chris Luzier at 7:39 pm. There were approximately 57 people in attendance (51 adults, 6 juniors). It was M/S/P to approve the minutes of the 14 October 2024 regular meeting and of the 21 October 2024 Board of Directors Meeting.

Announcements: Ken Reynolds had flyers for the Northern Virginia Mineral Club show the upcoming weekend. Chris Luzier had flyers for the GLMSMC show to be distributed by members at upcoming shows and elsewhere. The December meeting will be a potluck. Please bring a dish to share. There will be another auction of material from the Muir Collection. Members will have the opportunity to swap or sell up to 2 flats of material. There will be a gift exchange. To participate please bring a wrapped hobby related gift valued at less than \$25 and labelled as to category.

Membership: Visitors introduced themselves and spoke about their interests. Doug reminded members that membership renews in January. He can begin collecting dues at the December meeting.

Treasurer: The treasurer reported the club is solvent.

Field Trips: A trip to Penn-MD quarry during the upcoming weekend was discussed.

Election: The slate of candidates for election were President: Chris Luzier, Vice-President: Heather Vineyard, Secretary: Jeff Cessna, and Treasurer: Jonathan Harris, as announced in the most recent newsletter. The opportunity was given for any nominations from the floor. It was M/S/P to accept the slate of officers.

Newsletter: Member Maria Nopo has volunteered to assume the duties of Rockhounder editor.

Show: Dee Weiss will assist Chris Luzier in downstairs chair duties. This will allow an earlier departure on Friday night. However, Friday setup of show-cases will still be closed at a reasonable hour.

Program: Heather Vineyard introduced our speaker for the evening, our own Jake Margolis. The presentation was entitled Gold Deposits of Nevada With an Emphasis on Collectable Minerals. The opening slide had a backdrop of the mile-wide Twin Creeks open pit mine to emphasize the scale of mining in Nevada. Nevada includes the Great Basin, run-off does not go to the ocean. This and the basin and range geology caused by the crust pulling apart aids in the concentration of gold through several processes. Ninety percent of deposits are Carlin Trend type where gold precipitates from hot fluids at the edges of basins. The other main type of concentration is from hot springs. Jake gave examples of both types and how individual locality characteristics lead to collectable minerals being formed at the gold deposits, such as banded visible gold, and several less common minerals, such as naumannite, adularia, miargyrite, stibnite, banded stibnite, cinnabar, corderoite, kleinite, barite in many forms, galkhaite, variscite, hewetite, wavellite, millerite, and nevadaite. There were many questions from the audience. Jake invited those interested to view specimens on display, including many featured in the presentation. Thanks, Jake.

An auction of spheres and mineral specimens from the collection of Andy Muir was previewed under UV illumination. The auction was administered by Diane, assisted by Gary.

Show table and door prizes were administered by Joel Rosen.

Adjournment: It was M/S/P to adjourn the meeting at 9:59 PM.

GLMSMC Board of Directors Meeting Minutes from November 11, 2024

The 11 November 2024 Board of Directors meeting was called to order at 7:40 PM by Jonathan Harris. The agenda included Rockhounder editor, auctions, the holiday party, and regular reports.

Board Members Present: Doug Baum, Andy Celmer, Jeff Cessna, Jonathan Harris, Dan Kohn, Gary Leaman, Karen Lottes, Chris Luzier, and Joel Rosen. Guest Present: Diane Leaman.

Treasurer: Jonathan reported that no additional payments were made since last report. Some payments are due from recent auctions. Joel inquired if trailer repair expenses had been submitted. They have. It was noted that the trailer will need new, heavy sidewall, tires in the next year. Club donations to other organizations were discussed, based on past donations and funds available in the budget. It was M/S/P to donate to the Smithsonian Museum of Natural History, the Natural History Society of Maryland, and Wildacres.

Show: Chris prepared show flyers to distribute at the upcoming Lebanon mineral show. Ken Reynolds and others will distribute show flyers at the Northern Virginia show. Additional flyers will be available for member at the November regular meeting. Chris reported that he has agreed to stand for president in the upcoming election and will serve for 1 year. He is willing to remain as show chair with assistance from Dee Weiss. It was noted that volunteer service hours could be earned since the club is a 501(c)(3) organization. A form would need to be signed by a BOD member.

Rockhounder: Chris Luzier reported that junior member Maria Nopo had expressed interest in serving as Rockhounder editor. Maria will assist with the next issue and will take over after that.

Property: The trailer needs to be rearranged or at least the cardboard needs to be checked to avoid ruining display case storage boxes. Several 2 x 4s will be purchased to separate the cases from the walls to allow them to be covered by tarps while remaining away from water that might leak down the walls of the trailer. Joel will investigate obtaining tires local to the trailer storage area.

Auctions: Chris, Jeff, Gary and Diane discussed the auction agreement and selected 9 spheres and 10 mineral specimens from the Muir collection to be auctioned during the November meeting. Additional materials will be selected for auction during the holiday party. Chris Luzier will investigate reprinting the Muir memorial T-Shirts. New shirts will be a new color. The distribution of donated lapidary material will be moved from the December meeting to the April meeting.

Holiday Party: Members will have the opportunity to swap or sell up to 2 flats of material at the Holiday party. The door prizes will be moved earlier in the meeting to allow Joel to depart early. Ken Reynolds was suggested to run the gift exchange. Punch will not be made. Chris will bring water. Jonathan will bring sodas, plates, cups, napkins, utensils, storage bags, and tablecloths. Andy Celmer will bring a cooler and ice. An additional cooler will be needed. Thank You to the Senior Center staff will be coordinated.

Programs: The Reel Mine and a Smithsonian program are being worked on as well.

No other reports were made.

December 9th Meeting:




