November Speaker Information

Speaker: Jacob (Jake) Margolis

Title of Talk: "Gold Deposits of Nevada With a Focus on Collectible Minerals"

Jacob (Jake) Margolis is a member of the GLMSMC and is a recently-retired economic geologist. Economic geology is concerned with the characteristics and genesis of mineral deposits, mostly metallic, as well as the exploration for mineral deposits. He spent nearly 40 years conducting gold exploration and gold-deposit research in the western U.S. and western Canada. He has a Bachelor's of Science degree in Geology from the University of Maryland, a Master's from the University of Washington, and Doctorate from the University of Oregon.

Jake will review two of the most important types of gold deposits in Nevada, volcanic-hosted hot spring or epithermal deposits, and sediment-hosted Carlintype deposits, with a focus on the collectible minerals they contain, such as barite, stibnite, gold, orpiment, realgar and cinnabar. He'll also discuss

Property Manager: Joel Rosen discussed a trip to the trailer storage location by Joel, Chris, Jonathan, Gary, and Diane to seal the roof of the large club trailer. Photos of the efforts were posted to the club Facebook page.

Program: Heather Vineyard introduced our speaker for the evening, our own Steve Calamuci. The presentation was on photographing minerals. An emphasis was placed on photography using an Apple smartphone. Steve showed photos demonstrating difficult to photograph minerals and described the steps taken to overcome the difficulties.

Controlling lighting is an important aspect. Starting with a ring light, photos can be taken through the center to avoid reflections. If photographing from another angle, white cards can be used to directionally reflect light. Aluminum foil can be used to strongly reflect light. Gauze material, such as a light box, can be used to surround the specimen with diffuse light. White and black are used to avoid introducing a color cast.

More expensive equipment is still necessary to create photos than can be blown up to large sizes without noticeable loss of resolution. Steve demonstrated the capability of newer iPhones to take 3D images, assisted by LIDAR. The presentation was very interactive, with the audience asking questions and offering their individual experiences. Thanks, Steve.

An auction of lapidary material was administered by Diane and assisted by Gary.

The Show Table and Door Prizes were administered by Joel Rosen.

Adjournment: It was M/S/P to adjourn the meeting at 9:40 PM.




