## GLMSMC Regular Meeting from September 9th, 2024

The September 9th, 2024 meeting was called to order by Past-President Chris Luzier at 7:40 PM. There were approximately 44 (40 adults, 4 juniors) people in attendance. A motion passed to approve the minutes of the June 10th, 2024 regular meeting. A motion passed to approve the minutes of the June 24th, 2024 BOD meeting, with the following changes: "Gary Leaman said he would" was amended to "Gary Leaman suggested."

**Membership:** Doug Baum welcomed everybody back from the summer. He reminded members that the membership year was changed and dues are now paid before January. He welcomed guests.

**BOD:** A president is still needed for the club. Past Presidents Eric, Chris, Andy, and Mark were recognized in attendance.

**Show:** It is early for planning for the show, but it was announced that the BOD had previously decided and was now implementing a \$1 increase for admission to the show.

**Treasurer:** Jonathan Harris reported the club is solvent. The club received a generous donation from the Patuxent Lapidary Guild after their closure.

**Picnic:** Chris discussed the upcoming annual potluck picnic and sale. There was not time to prep all the club donations for sale. Club members were welcomed to bring up to 3 flats to swap or sell. Members were requested to bring their own change. There will be a quick auction from club donations. Details of timeline, organization, and potluck were discussed.

**EFMLS Liaison:** Andy Celmer stated that upcoming shows had been submitted for publication in the Rockhounder, including the show in Howard County and the Franklin, NJ show.

**Field Trips:** The opportunity to collect at Willis Mountain was discussed for September 21st. Registration details were given. Marco Molinaro discussed field trips to Harpers Ferry and Mount Pleasant Mills. Trips in planning included Penn-MD quarry in October or November and a potential return to Harpers Ferry in the fall or spring.

**Announcements:** The upcoming Desautels Micromount Symposium of the Baltimore Mineral Society was announced, occurring 4-6 October 2024.

**Program:** Heather Vineyard introduced our speaker for the evening, our own Frank Roddy. The talk was entitled "Weird Stuff Out West." Frank took members on a tour of the weird geological related sites people can visit mainly in the western US. For each type of place, from slot canyons, to fumaroles, to lava tubes, and beyond, he gave an outline of the location and discussed the geological background. Also discussed were lenticular clouds; Mt. Rainier; jökulhlaups; glacial moraines; pyroclastic flows; obsidian; haboobs; The Wave at Coyote Buttes, AZ; natural arches; avalanches; Hell's Canyon; calderas,

from Yellowstone to Crater Lake; and cinnabar in the Painted Hills. Closer to home, he showed us the DC area's closest volcano, Trimble Knob in Monterey, VA. Frank took several questions from an Interested audience. Thanks, Frank.
