Title of Talk: Collecting at the Reel Mine, Iron

Station, NC

Our February presentation will be provided by James Hall who is the owner of the Reel Mine in Iron Station, North Carolina. This mine is world famous for its incredible amethyst specimens and James has found some remarkable pockets during their ownership, dating back to 2016. They have donated specimens to museums all over the world, that are currently on display. This list includes the Smithsonian Institution Natural History Museum, The University of Arizona Alfie Norville Gem & Mineral Museum in Tucson, along with the world-famous Mim Mineral Museum. They also have donated specimens to the Maine Mineral Museum in Bethel, and the amethysts from this mine are truly world-class.

James will share many stories of his time at the mine and show some of the truly amazing amethysts that they have been able to preserve. There will be a question and answer period, as well as show and tell. Feel free to bring in any amethyst specimens of your own to show the group.

The 20 January 2025 Board of Directors meeting was called to order at 7:34 PM by Chris Luzier. The agenda included the show, budget, and regular reports.

Show: Chris reported on the progress for the show. There was an increase in the contract for tables and chairs. The ATM request has been placed. Dealer payments are coming in. The Admissions and Kid's Mini-mine sections need more volunteers on the sign-up sheets. Demonstrators are also arranged for cabochon making (we need more members to volunteer for this as well), The Reel Amethyst Mine, The Gem Cutters Guild of Baltimore, Minerals In Context (Thomas Hale), The Natural History Society of Maryland, Robert Clemenzi and his Physics Demo, along with Gold Panning with the M&D GPAA Chapter. More exhibitors are also needed for the cases. Assistance with electrical setup is needed to learn for future setups. Trailer tire replacement will be arranged pre-show. Previously budgeted amounts are sufficient for tires and towing to shop. Holly volunteered to process the backlog of show-collected contact information. This will provide input to bulk email provider. Emails, social media, and the group website need to be engaged to promote the show. The large banner will be hung at the close of the weekend before the show. Contacts needed with PTAs, homeschool groups, scout groups, and 4H to increase youth attendance. Karen has information for the first three. Perhaps the Fairgrounds can help provide contacts for the 4-H program. Food service has been coordinated.

**Treasurer:** Jonathan Harris distributed a budget prior to meeting. Specific items were discussed. Meeting door prizes are budgeted. Show door prizes are budgeted, but material is available from donations and prior shows. Delivery of donations from last years budget are still being arranged. Jonathan distributed a revised budget for email discussion and voting.

**Membership:** Many more members paid at last meeting. An announcement will go our reminding others.

The secretary thanked Dan Kohn for recoding minutes at the January regular meeting.

No other regular reports.

**Adjournment:** It was M/S/P to adjourn the meeting at 8:28 pm.


